### Trade Means Growth for Arizona

International trade—exports and imports of goods and services—supports 830,000 jobs in Arizona, or about 1 in 5 total jobs in the state.

Key facts about trade and jobs:

- The share of Arizona jobs supported by trade has nearly doubled since the early 1990s.
- Jobs in export-intensive industries offer compensation that averages about 16 percent higher than other jobs.
- · Imports let American families stretch their budgets and help U.S. manufacturers keep costs down and competitiveness up.
- · Nearly 7,400 Arizona companies exported in 2022. Nationally, 97% of trading firms are small-and medium sized enterprises.
- · Since 2008, companies that import or export goods have accounted for 3 out of 5 new American jobs.

# Arizona companies exported \$45 billion in goods and services in 2023 to more than 190 markets around the world.



America's FTA partners account for just 6% of the world's population but purchased 48% of Arizona's goods exports in 2023.

Arizona's goods exports to the Netherlands were \$1.6 billion in 2023, an over 400% increase since 2014.

Canada was the top export market for services exports in 2023 at \$1.4 billion.

Arizona's total goods and services exports increased by \$12 billion (38%) between 2014 and 2023.

In 2023, Arizona exported \$28 billion in goods and \$17 billion in services — a 10-year high for each.

Most services export growth has been driven by digital trade, which is allowing more Arizona companies to reach customers abroad more easily.

Arizona's top computers and electronic exports in 2023 were semiconductors (\$2.4 billion) and photosensitive semiconductor devices (\$892 million).

Arizona's top agricultural exports in 2023 were hay (\$162 million) and fresh vegetables such as peppers and gourds (\$135 million).

Arizona's exports of digitally tradable services reached \$10 billion in 2023.

### Foreign-headquartered companies directly employ 140,600 Arizona workers.

British-owned companies employ the most Arizona workers (29,900), followed by Canadian-owned companies (22,300).

Each job at a foreign-owned company typically supports three other U.S. jobs indirectly.

In 2021, U.S. affiliates of foreign-owned companies employed 8 million Americans, exported \$412 billion in goods, and spent \$78 billion on R&D.
